Adolph Hitler, 88, born April, 1889.

General Kurt Student, Germany, 88, New York Times, July 7, 1978

World War I fighter pilot.

1. NAZIS
Former paratrooper, division into Hitler's "blitzkrieg!"

2. Gen Student
Chief of Germany's flying, airborne weapons school.

Developed troop invasion of Holland, Belgium, Norway.

1943, rescued Mussolini on Italy's Abruzzi peak, landed 50 men.

Captured May 28, 1945, Sentenced to "five years", appealed, got off.

1949, Commissioned by BRITISH AND AMERICAN FORCES to establish
a WEST GERMANY AIR FORCE.

Went back to England to study with THE ROYAL AIR FORCE AND AVIATION
INDUSTRY.

Notice how war criminal, who
bombed Europe, USA troops, Hitler's
pet agent, wined and dined by USA
and British military establishment.

Ernest Robert Breech, 81, Aviation and Automotive Official. New York Times,

1. Breech
Chairman of board of Bendix Aviation Corporation.

2. Ford Motor
Co.
Chairman of Trans World Airways, and Ford Motor Company.

Helped "rebuild Ford" after World War. Profits rose to \$500 million yr.

"Postwar revitalization of Ford Motor Co".

President of board of North American Aviation, 1933, then a Ford
affiliate.

U.S. Government requested him to serve on Atomic Energy panel, 1955.

Otto W. Timm, Pioneer of U.S. Aviation, 84. L.A. Times 7/5/78. New York Times, 7/8

1. Timm
"Man who gave Charles A. Lindberg his first airplane".

Came to Calif. 1916 to train Army pilots.

2. NAZI
1922, working for aircraft company. Lindberg wanted to learn to fly.

3. LINDBERGH
General Student, Nazi to END.

Ernest Breech, Ford, funded
Adolph Hitler into power.

Lindberg, associate of Timm,
ardent follower of Hitler, Nazi

U.S. Navy intelligence, China.

U.S. Navy, Korean conflict.

Pentagon, Air Force, Defense Intelligence Agency, 1962.

ARMY COL. JOHN W. Lay, 59, From 1961-1965, with Secretary of Army.

Leo Patrick Culinane, 71, Former White House Correspondent.

Felix J. Belair Jr., 70, Time, New York Times reporter. Covered Presidents
from 1936 to 1964, after JFK assassination.

Cecil Holland, 70, Wash. Star reporter, covered President's campaigns,
like Belair, from 1940 through 1967.

Col. James E. Nicholson, 56, Office of Emergency Preparedness, until 19...
office Watergate defendant James McCord worked with.

1. Deaths
